Seeing Is Believing?

The story of the gospel is enlightening and sobering. The stark contrast between a man blind from birth and a group of religion teachers, namely, Pharisees, is instructive. The one whose sight is restored now speaks plainly, simply describing what he sees. The experts of the Law bring a lot of baggage which may have a hint of pious and legal knowledge but their half-cooked knowledge becomes an impediment to their proper perception of reality. When one deals with something of God, one may want to be deferential and not so judgmental, but listen to what these people have to say about Jesus: “This man is not from God, because he does not keep the sabbath.” They also have a complete presumption of the condition of the man born blind, which prompts them to say: “You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?”

Amazing, isn't it? Apparently, seeing is not necessarily believing! Those who presume their ability to see are in fact blind and deny the reality. We hope we do not persist in this type of psychology of denial. Jesus towards the end of today's story says: “I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind.”

Often we may presume that we know the mind of God and Jesus teaches us today how dangerous that can be. There are people leaning towards religious triumphalism, openly talking about God more often than before, insisting on witch-hunting militant forms of self-appointed orthodox police and asking God's favor in political gatherings. On the other hand, there is also the tyranny of secular humanism, self-serving moral relativism, disguised atheism, or trivializing indifferentism regarding faith, excluding God in public arena altogether. Majority popular opinions do not change wrong into right. When one denies the truth of the natural law and a Christian refuses to accept the revelation of the Christian Scriptures regarding marriage in the name of equality, moral relativism achieves its goals. Is there room for God in that stance? Is there the absolute in our thinking and judging? Every assertion cannot be equally right? A Catholic thinker observes that moral relativism is public enemy number one, because it leads to the destruction of a civilization.

While we need to be aware and wary of the lure of intoxicating self-righteousness in the form of ‘God is on my side’, indifferentism or atheism tries to drive God out of sight. Presumption is always risky. Jesus says to the Pharisees: “If you were blind, you would have no sin; but now you are saying, ‘We see,’ so your sin remains.”

Saint Theophilus of Antioch gives us an apt advice: “A person's soul should be clean, like a mirror reflecting light. If there is rust on the mirror his face cannot be seen in it. In the same way, no one who has sin within him can see God.”

It's time to clean our mirror. We continue our Lenten journey along with our catechumens so that our minds and hearts are in tune with Christ. So we ask ourselves: “Oh, say can you see?”

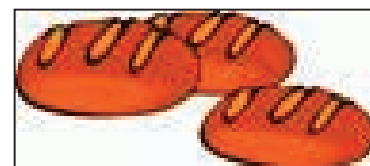

NOTES FOR LENT

Lent is a beautiful season; it is a season to repent for past sins, to train ourselves to avoid future sin, and ultimately, to grow closer to Jesus Christ. All Catholics are especially encouraged during Lent to attend frequent confession and to pray the Stations of the Cross. Please note our Lenten Schedule for these practices:

- 1) **Stations of the Cross** will take place every Friday during Lent, at 2 PM and 8 PM in English, and 7PM in Spanish.
- 2) **Confessions** will take place as usual on Saturdays from 3-4:30 PM, and additionally during Lent on Wednesdays from 7-8 PM.

One other note: Please do not leave any flowers at the Church during Lent. Flowers are not liturgically proper for this solemn season. Have a beautiful and grace-filled Lent!

Need another Lenten Resolution? We have ideas for you!

In Lent, many of us chose to “give something up”; to do without something we like or find ourselves dependent on. This is a beautiful practice which serves as a reminder for us: **Jesus** is the One we should center our hearts on, and He is all we need and depend on. To further your relationship with Him, consider also making an addition to your prayer life. Here are some suggestions:

- 1) Attend **Eucharistic Adoration!** Our parish is blessed to have adoration every Thursday from 9:30 am– 8 pm in the Convent Chapel. Spend time with Jesus.

Ver, es creer

La historia del Evangelio es esclarecedora y aleccionadora. El marcado contraste entre un hombre ciego de nacimiento y el de un grupo de maestros de religión, es decir, los fariseos, es instructiva. Aquel cuya vista es restaurada, ahora habla claramente, simplemente describiendo lo que ve. Los expertos de la ley le llevan un montón de equipaje, que puede tener un atisbo de piedad y conocimientos piadosos, pero su conocimiento medio cocido se convierte en un impedimento para su adecuada percepción de la realidad. Cuando uno trata con algo de Dios, uno debería ser humilde y diferente.

Sin embargo, escuchen lo que estas personas tienen que decir acerca de Jesús: "Este hombre no es de Dios, porque no guarda el sábado." "También tienen una completa presunción de la condición del hombre nacido ciego, que los lleva a decir:" Naciste completamente en pecado, y estás tratando de enseñarnos? "

Increíble, ¿no? Al parecer, ver no es siempre creer. Quienes presumen su capacidad de ver son, de hecho, ciegos para negar la realidad. Esperamos que no persistamos en este tipo de psicología de arrogancia y negación. Hacia el final de la historia del evangelio de hoy Jesús dice: "Yo vine a este mundo para el juicio, para que los ciegos vean, y los que ven queden ciegos".

A veces suponemos que conocemos la mente de Dios y hoy Jesús nos enseña lo peligroso que puede ser. Hay personas que se inclinan hacia el triunfalismo religioso, hablando abiertamente más a menudo de Dios que antes, insistiendo en forma militante prácticamente autonombrado policía ortodoxo y pidiendo el favor de Dios en reuniones políticas. Por otra parte, es la tiranía del humanismo secular, el relativismo moral, ateísmo disfrazado o trivializar la indiferencia con respecto a la fe, excluyendo a Dios completamente en la plaza pública



La mayoría de comentarios populares no cambian equivocado por verdad. Cuando uno niega la verdad de la ley natural y un cristiano se niega a aceptar la revelación de las escrituras cristianas sobre el matrimonio en nombre de la igualdad, el relativismo moral logra sus objetivos. ¿Hay lugar para Dios en esa postura? ¿Existe el absoluto en nuestra manera de pensar y juzgar? ¿Cada afirmación no puede ser igual? Un pensador católico observa que el relativismo moral es el enemigo público número uno, porque conduce a la destrucción de una civilización.

Si bien debemos ser conscientes y cuidadosos con el señuelo de intoxicar la rectitud en la forma de 'Dios está de mi lado', la presunción es siempre arriesgada. Jesús le dice a los fariseos: "si estuvieran ciegos, no tendrían ningún pecado; pero ahora que dicen, 'vemos,' su pecado permanece. "

San Teófilo de Antioquía nos da un consejo "el alma de la persona debe ser limpia, como un espejo que refleja luz. Si hay óxido en el espejo su cara no puede ser vista en él. De la misma manera, nadie que tenga pecado dentro de sí, puede ver a Dios."

Es hora de limpiar nuestro espejo. Continuamos nuestro camino cuaresmal junto con los catecúmenos para que nuestras mentes y nuestros corazones estén en sintonía con Cristo. Entonces nos preguntamos: "Oh, dime, puedes ver?"

De ustedes verdaderamente en Cristo, *Padre Paul D. Lee*
